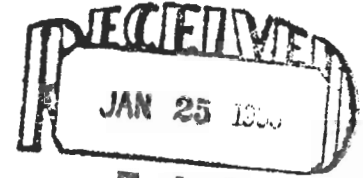

The Christmas dinner plans were discussed and attendance appears to be the same or perhaps even larger than last year.


